We are delighted to announce that we have achieved the School Games Silver Mark Award again for the 2018/19 academic year. The School Games Mark is a Government led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success. With over 70% of our children competing in local inter-school competitions this year, we are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport.
