Where a pupil or staff member tests positive, the rest of their class or group will be sent home and advised to selfisolate for 14 days. The other household members of the wider class or group do not need to self-isolate unless the pupil or staff member they live within that group subsequently develops symptoms.  We have a process in place to inform parents testing is required and how to book tests.  We will ask for evidence that children recommended having a test have done so and that the test is clear before they return to school.	Medium	Medium

If a child is awaiting collection, they will be moved, if possible, to a room where they can be isolated behind a closed door, depending on the age of the child and with appropriate adult supervision if required. Ideally, a window will be opened for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, we will move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from other people.  If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, we endeavour that they will use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom will be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else.  PPE will be worn by staff caring for the child while they await collection if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained (such as for a very young child or a child with complex needs). In an emergency, we will call 999 if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk. We will not suggest a visit to the GP, pharmacy, urgent care centre or a hospital.  If a member of staff has helped someone unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, we have noted they do not need to go home unless they develop symptoms themselves (and in which case, a test is available) or the child subsequently tests positive ('What happens if there is a confirmed case of coronavirus in a setting?' refers set out below).
