Quick reminder...

English

Our writing will be based around two bear-themed texts; Paddington Bear and Goldilocks and Everywhere Bear Julia Donaldson. Using these as example we will be writing captions, stories and letters and really working on our letter formation sentence structures and use of punctuation. Right from the start we will be using word banks and prompts to help us be more accurate with our spelling.

Maths

This half term is all about becoming more familiar with the number system and how it works. We will be ordering and comparing numbers using place value and solving problems in different contexts that will need us to add, subtract, multiply and divide. There will be lots of practise with our number bonds to 20 and for year 2, times tables. We will find out about new fractions and explore the properties of shape. We will also be measuring length, height and time.

Homework

This term children will be given links and Log in details for the programme Purple mash, here they will be able to access games, activities and homework tasks. At times homework may also be posted on the home learning link on the school class web page.

Science

We will be investigating animals and their habitats, in particular the different habitats and food chains you might find in a woodland setting. We will be using secondary sources of information but also taking trips to the playground or the woods to search out some animals for ourselves, to see where they live and why it suits them.



Geography

We will be looking at the world map and getting to know where some of the oceans, continents and countries are. We will then be comparing the woodlands of the world, seeing how they differ and how they might be the same. Our final focus will be a comparison between the New Forest and the Amazon Rainforest.

Foundation subjects

Art this half term is all about teddy bears and we will be using clay to try to model some of our own. In DT we will be designing and making sandwiches to share with you on a teddy bear's picnic and in ICT we will be illustrating famous bear stories using paint programmes on Purple Mash. During music sessions, we will start by learning about 'duration' through games, songs and the use of different percussion instruments.

PE

This term we have the wonderful opportunity to have a specialized gymnastics lessons on Mondays. Mr Holmes will continue to teach the children for a session on a dance or Please make sure children have full indoor and outdoor kit every day.
