I don't think I would commit to after school activities. Often with football parents would be kept in the dark as to whether it would go ahead even on the day, so we have stopped.

My children are very happy and settled at Grateley school. Any issues raised are dealt with quickly and I feel my children are well supported at school.

Actions arising from the survey analysis:

Explore additional clubs offered at school- both after school and at lunchtime following suggestions made.

Speak to the local school who has parent-led after school clubs to see how this is organised and facilitated.

Investigate additional ways in which we can support the wider personal development of the children at Grateley.

Explore different ways (in addition to current communication) that the school team can inform parents of how their child is doing. Possibly re-introducing the end of term class showcases and/or opportunities for parents to be welcomed into school for informal come in and see what we have been learning in class this week sessions.
