Dear Parents and Carers,

Maths Curriculum

I am excited to inform you that after half term we will be starting White Rose Maths across the school. The staff have been involved in training last term and this term in preparation and we are all excited to follow the new curriculum and use the new resources with the children. White Rose Maths uses a small-step, mastery approach to ensure children are secure in their knowledge and understanding of the mathematical concepts.

Celebration Assembly

Since September, I have been encouraging children to reflect on their learning and achievements over the week and proudly share them in celebration assembly on a Friday. At the start of the assembly the children share with the school what they are proud of and it is lovely to hear the wide variety of achievements from writing in joined up handwriting, to playing with a new friend on the playground and learning a new concept in Maths. Please speak to your children and encourage them to verbalise what they are proud of achieving. I want all children to realise they should be proud and some achievements may seem small to some but big to others and it is important we all develop our self-confidence and reflecting to be proud is one way to do this. I have also encouraged children to bring in achievements from out of school so they can stand up in assembly and confidently speak about them. We have had children sharing achievements in swimming, a group of children working very hard to beat a world record, along with running marathons and completing reading challenges. If you child has something they would like to share then please encourage them to bring it in on a Friday. This is developing their public speaking, their confidence to stand up in front of a large audience and their pride in their achievements.

All staff, including supply staff, volunteers and governors, must ensure that they are aware of these procedures. Parents and carers are welcome to read the Policy on request. Sometimes we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a child's welfare. We will ensure that our concerns about our pupils are discussed with his/her parents/carers first unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the child's welfare.

If you are concerned about a child's welfare, please record your concern, and any observations or conversation heard, and report to one of the Designated Safeguarding Leads as soon as possible on the same day.

DO NOT conduct your own investigation.

If your concerns relate to the actions or behaviour of a member of staff (which could suggest that he/she is unsuitable to work with children) then you should report this to the head teacher in confidence. If the concern relates to the Head Teacher you contact the Local Authority Designated Officers, LADO, on 01962 876364, who will consider what action to take.
