Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has been a busy and exciting week with various activities in all classrooms linked to Children's Mental Health Week. This year's theme is 'My Voice Matters' and children have been exploring this in a variety of ways. We have had some of our KS2 children working with KS1 to explore ways to stay happy with art and puzzle activities whilst in Year R they have been considering their 'happy place' and exploring 'how to listen' making telephone cups.

We have organised for a parent, who is an artist, to very kindly come into school and lead Art workshops across the school - this is in the parent diary. Many children love art and we are trying to introduce more opportunities to develop this artistic flair, giving them more opportunity to engage in Art and learning new skills along the way.

Safeguarding

As it is Children's Mental Health week I have chosen to share information and advice on mental health this week. Mental health is a subject that many of us find difficult to discuss, primarily because of a fear of saying the wrong thing and making matters worse. Mental ill health is however a prevalent issue, with it being estimated that around 1 in 6 children will experience some form of mental ill health at some point in their childhood.

The definition of mental health is:

A state of mental well-being that enables people to cope with the stresses of life, realise their abilities, learn well and work well, and contribute to their community. It is an integral component of health and well-being that underpins our individual and collective abilities to make decisions, build relationships and shape the world we live in. Mental health is a basic human right.

Ways to help children with their mental health

For children to remain mentally well they need:

- good physical health (including good diet and regular exercise).











- to be able to explore and develop interests (through their environment, play and interaction with others).
- to feel part of a family (feeling as though they belong, get along with others, are loved, valued and safe).
- to be supported to learn, be optimistic and feel that they have a say.
- to feel part of a community (e.g. school / nursery / etc.).
- to be supported to cope when things do not go well.
- to be supported to learn how to problem solve.

Safeguarding Children at Grateley Primary School

Grateley Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. This means that we have a Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy and procedures in place, which we refer to in our prospectus. All staff, including supply staff, volunteers and governors, must ensure that they are aware of these procedures. Parents and carers are welcome to read the Policy on request. Sometimes we may need to share information and work in partnership with other agencies when there are concerns about a child's welfare. We will ensure that our concerns about our pupils are discussed with his/her parents/carers first unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the child's welfare.

Our Designated Safeguarding Leads are: Mrs A Norman – Acting Head Teacher Miss D Knights – Class Teacher Safeguarding Governor is: Mrs Victoria Rutherford Our Chair of Governors is: Mrs Amelia Bridges

If you are concerned about a child's welfare, please record your concern, and any observations or conversation heard, and report to one of the Designated Safeguarding Leads as soon as possible on the same day.

DO NOT conduct your own investigation.

If your concerns relate to the actions or behaviour of a member of staff (which could suggest that he/she is unsuitable to work with children) then you should report this to the head teacher in confidence. If the concern relates to the Head Teacher you contact the Local Authority Designated Officers, LADO, on 01962 876364, who will consider what action to take.
